

Short-Term Resident Fellow Program of the OBIC

The OBIC invites researchers from China, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Indonesia, Malaysia, India, Singapore and other countries from the South East Asian region to join the Oriental Business and Innovation Center of the Budapest Business School in Budapest for a period between 1 week and 2 weeks. The initiative is aimed at supporting the international dimension of the BBS by encouraging the incoming mobility of foreign Researchers and Professors.

The total number of positions which can be funded will be defined during the selection process, in relation to the number of submitted applications. The OBIC accepts applications on an ongoing basis until the 31st of May, 2017.

Invited fellows will be granted accommodation and transportation costs. They will be provided with office space and enjoy the opportunity to discuss projects and exchange ideas with Budapest Business School Fellows.

Short term resident fellows are required to present their ongoing research in BBS Workshop. Fellows are strongly encouraged to submit their research paper to scientific journals published by the BBS. At the same time, they are invited to take part in the center's manifold academic activities. (Hungarian language skills are not required.)

Interested applicants should submit

- an academic CV,
- an extended research proposal (around 1000 words),
- a statement on their intention to publish the paper in scientific journals of the BBS,
- in the case PHD students a letter of recommendation by a professor of the institution where they are enrolled or affiliated.
